21 attended the May meeting at the Government Center, including a visit from **Andy Roeske**, a former Admirals V-32 skipper and **Brady Holderead** from Noblesville who was referred to us through former member Bill Birthright.

We discussed the upcoming Admirals Picnic scheduled for Sunday, June 24th, the Westfield Grand Park, and Minimono reliability issues. Final details of our picnic will be ironed out at the upcoming June14th meeting. Minimono coupler drive shaft issues remain unresolved in light of 4 phone calls made to Hobbico from our membership after **Dave Hampton's** plea. Regarding Grand Park, we determined that the Admirals cannot commit to Westfield to make their facility our "home" facility or to run all but submarine regattas there to the exclusion of the Carmel Veterans Memorial Reflecting Pond, West Clay Hourglass Pond, and the 75th St and Shadeland fast electric pond. We also determined that we cannot afford the costs of creating a dock and signage at Grand Park just for occasional use.
